PRESENTATION SUBMISSIONS

A detailed submission within CAEP's conference management portal (XCD) is required for accreditation and visibility within the public program.

The portal (https://www.xcdsystem.com/caep) is open until January 15 (11:59PM ET) to allow for submissions and edits, however any substantial changes to topics or lead speakers will require approval by the Conference Planning Committee and may result in the acceptance being reconsidered. Substantial changes (session title or lead speakers, for example) must be submitted in writing via email to jgale@caep.ca.

By January 15, Lead Presenters must ensure that all speakers within their session(s) have:

- created an account in XCD.
- been added to the session(s) to XCD. You will be prompted to add co-presenters after you have submitted your presentation.
- completed the COI Declaration and Slide Disclosure within XCD.

Submission instructions:

- 1. Log in or create an account at https://www.xcdsystem.com/caep.
- 2. Click on ICEM2025 Presentation & Workshop Submissions.
- 3. You will be prompted to complete the Conflict-of-Interest Declaration and Slide Disclosure as this is required for accreditation.
- 4. Once completed, continue to submit your presentation.
- 5. After submitting, continue to add co-presenters. Please only include co-presenters who will be participating in your session. Do not include co-authors who will not be presenting at the conference.

Co-presenters will receive an email from XCD notifying them that they have been added to the submission and that they must complete their COI Declaration and Slide Disclosure by **January 15**.

Both forms must be submitted by anyone who is speaking at the conference.

Please ensure your XCD profile is up to date at https://www.xcdsystem.com/caep (bio, headshot, title, designation, and email address) by **January 15**. Some of the information in your profile will automatically be transferred into the conference program for public view.

VISA INVITATION LETTERS

If you require an invitation letter for Visa application purposes, please click here to complete the request form.

This should be completed as soon as possible by individuals who require a letter for immigration purposes to Canada as the VISA application process could take up to 12 weeks. For more information, please visit the IRCC website.

CONFERENCE REGISTRATION

Please do not register if you are presenting three or more times throughout the conference. Faculty members who present a minimum of three times in the Core Scientific Program (Sunday, May 25 – Wednesday, May 28th) will receive complimentary conference registration and one Welcome Event ticket.

Presentations include concurrent tracks, Marketplace, and plenary presentations. They do not include research abstract presentations or posters.

Details on how to apply your complimentary registration will follow. In the meantime, please ensure you have updated or created a profile at www.caep.ca as this is required to register for the conference.

If you are <u>not</u> presenting a minimum of 3 times during the Core Scientific Program, please click here to register by February 1.

All speakers are responsible for their own transportation and accommodations.

Creating a profile at **on the CAEP website** does not mean you have registered for the conference. ACCREDITATION REQUIREMENTS

For accreditation purposes, you must ensure adherence to using generic rather than trade names of medications and/or devices within all presentations and written materials.

You must display the 1st slide disclosure and address it verbally at the start of your presentation (if you have nothing to declare you must still state that).

The Planning Committee will review all disclosed financial relationships and determine whether action is required to manage potential or real conflicts of interest. Any individual who fails to disclose their relationship(s) as required cannot participate as a speaker of this certified activity.

All presentations must be reviewed by the Track Chairs in advance of the conference. Please submit your presentation slides to your Track Chair by **April 18**.

Presenters are encouraged (but not required) to use the ICEM2025 Presentation Template. If you are not using the presentation template, the slide disclosure mentioned above must still be included at the start of your presentation.

PowerPoint presentations should be in the 16:9 format.

Once all required documentation is received, your session will be added to the public program. Exact timing and location of your session will be available in February.



AUDIO/VISUAL EQUIPMENT

Track rooms will be set-up in theatre style for the duration of the conference and will include a stage, projector, table, chairs, podium, and microphones.

Laptops will also be provided in each of the track rooms. Please have your presentation ready on a USB drive as you will be required to visit the Speaker Ready Room in the conference centre in advance of your session to upload your presentation. Your presentation will be casted to your respective track room and session.

Speakers are responsible for sourcing any additional equipment necessary for their sessions (e.g., simulation equipment, markers, flipcharts).
